

State Booster Seat Use Requirements in the U.S.

As of June 7, 2006, 37 States and the District of Columbia had enacted provisions in their child restraint laws requiring the use of a booster seat or other appropriate restraint device by children who have outgrown their forward-facing child safety seats, but who are still too small to use an adult safety belt system correctly.

The following jurisdictions have enacted these lifesaving provisions:
